

# About The Italian Girl in Algiers

- Rossini wrote L'italiana in Algeri (The Italian Girl in Algiers Overture) when he was 21.
- The overture is widely recorded and performed today, known for its distinct opening of slow, quiet pizzicato basses, leading to a sudden loud burst of sound from the full orchestra.
- This "surprise" reflects Rossini's early admiration for Joseph Haydn, whose *Symphony No. 94 in G Major*, "The Surprise Symphony," is so named for the same shocking and semi-comic effect.

# Tchaikovsky's Romeo and Juliet

- Romeo and Juliet is styled an "overture-fantasy" and based on Shakespeare's play.
- Tchaikovsky was deeply inspired by Shakespeare and also wrote works based on The Tempest and Hamlet.
- At first Romeo and Juliet was not successful in Russia and Europe.
- Its initial failure induced Tchaikovsky to rework the piece.
- The third and final version, penned 10 years after his first reworking, is the one that is now in the repertoire.

## About Piano Concerto No. 21

- Mozart completed the Piano Concerto No. 21 in C major,
   K. 467, on 9 March 1785, just four weeks after completing the D minor concerto, K. 466.
- The second movement was featured in the 1967 Swedish film
   Elvira Madigan with Geza Anda as soloist. As a result, the piece
   has become widely known as the Elvira Madigan concerto.
- Neil Diamond's 1972 piece Song Sung Blue was based on a theme from the andante movement of the concerto.



## **About the VSA Logo**



- Our logo was created to strategically identify our organization by name and infuse visual elements that distinguish our purpose, approach, and locale.
- The stylized treble and bass clefs integrated within the initials represent us as a musical organization.
- The five lines of the staff and double bar lines provide additional musical references.
- The staff also alludes to our locale, as the topmost line is a silhouette of the San Juan Mountain range that overlooks the Uncompangre, Grand, and North Fork Valleys from which our musicians hail.
- The graceful, yet animated font used in the initials suggests approachable elegance, a visual nod to our main focus on classical music.

#### About Aida

- Aida is an opera in four acts by Giuseppe Verdi to an Italian libretto by Antonio Ghislanzoni.
- The opera is set in the Old Kingdom of Egypt.
- The work holds a central place in the operatic canon, receiving performances every year around the world.
- Contrary to popular belief, the opera was not written to celebrate the opening of the Suez Canal in 1869, which Verdi had been invited to write an inaugural hymn, but declined.





# Backstory of Aida

- Egyptians have captured and enslaved Aida, an Ethiopian princess.
- Egyptian military commander Radames struggles to choose between his love for her and his loyalty to the King of Egypt.
- Meanwhile, the King's daughter Amneris is in love with Radames, although he does not return her feelings.





## Backstory of Aida

- The love triangle culminates with Radames sentenced to being buried alive, and Amneris rues his accusers and weeps while he is taken away.
- Buried alive in a tomb, Radames' last thoughts are of Aida, when suddenly she appears, having slipped in earlier to share his terrible fate.
- Together they bid farewell to Earth and its sorrows.

### About Violin Concerto in D minor, op.22

- Written during the relatively stable period of Wieniawski's residence in St Petersburg, the *Violin Concerto in D minor, op.22* is generally considered as his finest work.
- It remains one of the most popular violin concertos of the Romantic era, memorable for its lush and moving melodies and harmonies.
- Anton Rubinstein (Russian pianist, composer and conductor, and founder of the Saint Petersburg Conservatory) called Henryk Wieniawski, "the greatest violinist of his time."

- Fidelio is Ludwig van Beethoven's only opera.
- The work has a long and complicated history of composition: it went through three versions during Beethoven's career.
- Some of the music was first written as part of an earlier, never-completed opera.

### **About Porgy and Bess**

- George Gershwin called *Porgy and Bess* a "folk opera," which placed him in a long line of composers who drew inspiration from folk themes, real or imagined.
- It premiered on Broadway in 1935, and its music took root in American culture, spawning orchestral arrangements, concert versions, and jazz standards.
- It has endured and thrived, and still resonates with audiences of all backgrounds.





### **About Porgy and Bess**

- As one of the first American operas, Porgy and Bess has entertained, and sometimes enraged, generations of audiences.
- While it opened up valuable opportunities for black artists, it was criticized by some as an inappropriate depiction of black culture, with dialect that reinforced stereotypes.
- At its core, it's a very human story, a drama about connection and choices made in difficult times, with melodies that move us.
- Its music is some of the most well-known romantic music of the twentieth century.

- The film's music was composed by Ennio Morricone, an Italian composer, orchestrator, conductor, and trumpeter who wrote music in a wide range of styles.
- With more than 400 scores for cinema and television, as well as more than 100 classical works, Morricone is widely considered one of the most prolific and greatest film composers of all time.
