

Michael Kern has conducted the VSA Orchestra since 1993. He is a graduate of Butler University (located in Indianapolis, IN) with a bachelor's degree in music education and a master's degree in music composition. At Butler, he studied jazz string bass with David Baker, nationally-known jazz educator and head of the Indiana University School of Jazz.

Kern played string bass and electric bass guitar professionally for many years in all genres, from polka bands to jazz ensembles to symphony orchestras. He

has performed with with Marvin Gaye, Freddie Hubbard, Wes Montgomery, Doc Severinson, and Buddy DeFranco.

During the summer of 2001, Kern attended the prestigious International Workshop for Conductors in Kromeriz, Czech Republic. Formed by Dr. Harry Hurwitz of the University of Toronto and Artistic Director Maestro Kirk Trevor, the workshop offers musicians opportunities to gain experience rehearsing and conducting professional full orchestras. During an intensive two-week period, attendees prepare six major orchestral works for performance with the Bohuslov Martinu Philharmonic of Zlin, Czech Republic, which partnered with the workshop.







## KATY KRISTOFFERSEN Chorus Conductor

### **OUR HISTORY: BRINGING CLASSICAL MUSIC TO LIFE!**

In 1970 a small group of classical musicians met in the parlor of Wilma and Charles Lowell's Eckert home. By 1982, there were 30 musicians practicing once a week in Delta and performing four annual concerts. Over the years, the group has progressed, growing in size and musical ability.

In the late 1990s and early 2000s, the Grand Mesa Singers and the Christmas in the Valley Chorus were seasonal contributors, mainly at Christmas concerts. In 2002, these choral groups combined, and the Valley Symphony Orchestra (VSO) became the Valley Symphony Association (VSA) to include both orchestra and chorus.

Today, the VSA's 60+ instrumentalists and 35+ vocalists hail from throughout the North Fork, Uncompanyer, and Grand Valleys. Together, VSA musicians kickoff each season in early September with free Pops in the Park concerts in Cedaredge and Montrose. These outdoor shows are a gift to the regional community that supports the all-volunteer performing arts organization.

The VSA takes pride in their history of bringing classical music to life on the Western Slope, their commitment to keeping classical music vital, and their goal of building future audiences.

#### **OUR MUSICIANS**

Who performs in the VSA Orchestra and Chorus?

They are teachers, parents, neighbors, students. They have jobs. They have children. They have homes and schedules and commitments. They teach at local colleges, high schools, middle schools, and elementary schools. They work in business, the arts, government, agriculture, law enforcement, and health care. Some are retired. Some are entrepreneurs. Some are military veterans. They represent the Uncompandere, Grand, and North Fork Valleys and live in Montrose, Ouray, Hotchkiss, Eckert, Olathe,

Palisade, Paonia, Delta, Ridgway, Austin, Cedaredge, and Grand Junction. Some of them are snowbirds. Some of them are teenagers. And they are all VSA musicians.

This season we have over 100 performers who bring their skill, passion, and talent to the stage. The VSA is proud to be celebrating our 50th year as a regional, all-volunteer performing arts organization composed of musicians who live and work in our midst.

They attended their first VSA Chorus concert in December, 2003, at the Montrose United Methodist Church and were thrilled with the performance directed by Kelly Neill, the first VSA Chorus conductor (see page 13 for additional chorus history). Rod and Judy had been active church choir members in Kansas City. They discovered that Kelly was also from the Kansas City area and had been a singer in the Kansas City Chorale. In fact, Rod and Judy had frequented Chorale concerts when they lived in Kansas City—small world!

Rod began singing with the VSA Chorus for the March, 2004, spring concert and has sung in every concert since then through March, 2019, the last VSA Chorus (only) concert before today's performance. In addition to Kelly, Rod has performed under the direction of all VSA Chorus conductors (see page 8 for a full listing).

In addition to singing, Rod helped with the design and set-up of the chorus risers. He is still the Montrose "point man" for moving the VSA trailer and risers for all VSA concerts. Rod's faithful dedication to the VSA is certain testimony to his love of music. "Singing is just plain fun!"

Judy sang regularly with the chorus from December, 2010, through March, 2019. She had planned to retire but was persuaded back for the Season 50 Christmas concert. Today, she'll take part as an audience member.

Beyond the chorus stage, Rod and Judy love to travel. An interesting "flashback" about Judy: she spent time overseas in her teens and accomplished a trip around the world—some by cruise ship—before she reached the age of 18!

They are also railroad fans. Rod is "motorman" (driver) for Motor #1 replica at the Ridgway Railroad Museum. Judy loves to plan rail trips. This past summer they travelled to Alaska to ride all the beautiful routes of the Alaska Railroad.


